Rev. Alex Awad, International Peacemaker... Sept. 22 & 23, 3018

DMPC and D&E will host Rev. Alex Awad, International Peacemaker, for a free public lecture at Halliehurst on Davis & Elkins College campus September 22 at 4:00pm. He will also be at Sunday school on Sunday, September 23 at 9:30am, and preaching for us in worship at 11:00am. Please plan to attend one or all of these events for an opportunity to hear from him about issues related to Palestine and peace in the Israel/Palestine region and the challenges of interfaith dialogue.

Rev. Awad served as Dean of Students and full-time instructor at Bethlehem Bible College in Bethlehem where he served on the faculty for 24 years. He is a charter member of the College's Board of Directors and served since 1994 as senior pastor at East Jerusalem Baptist Church. He is a past board member of the Evangelical Local Council of Churches in the Holy Land, and directed the Shepherd Society, Bethlehem Bible College's charitable ministry. Alex and his wife Brenda have moved to the Pacific Northwest to be closer to their children.

WV CHURCH WOMEN UNITED ASSEMBLY

This will be held at the Quiet Dell United Methodist Church, located just off Exit 115 of I-79 in Harrison County. CWU will be collecting health kits and personal kits to be distributed to those in need in West Virginia. SHEREZADE TO PERFORM AT DMPC...

Internationally acclaimed soprano Sherezade (Sherry) Panthaki will share her beautiful voice with us during our September 30th service. While still in college, Sherry was a music intern at DMPC and she has always been grateful for that opportunity. She has shared her talents with us before and is anxious to once again return to her roots. If you have never heard her sing, you are in for a special treat. Her voice is at once angelic and strong. She sings the most difficult music effortlessly.

Highlights of Sherry's most recent performances include performances of Vivaldi's *Gloria* with the Los Angeles Philharmonic at the Hollywood Bowl and with the St. Louis Symphony. She returned to the Milwaukee Symphony and debuted with the Orlando Philharmonic. She performs with the Philharmonic Baroque Orchestra, Music of the Baroque, Ars Lyrica, and Bach Collegium Japan in a U.S. tour of Bach's *Christmas Oratorio*.

Sherry was born and raised in India and began her musical education at an early age. Following intensive study and earning top distinction as a young pianist, she turned to singing and found a more personal and expressive means to connect with audiences. She received her B.A. degree from West Virginia Wesleyan. She holds a Masters Degree in Voice Performance from Yale School of Music and the Yale Institute of Sacred Music. SUBMISSIONS FOR CONGREGATIONAL ADVENT DEVOTIONAL BOOKLET BEING SOUGHT

Many years ago, members of DMPC helped create a devotional booklet to be used daily during the Advent season. The Worship Committee would like to put together such a booklet this year. All we need is your help! Dr. Vial has agreed to write a devotional for each of the four Sundays in Advent – we need 20 more – one for each day including Christmas Eve and Christmas Day! If you would like to submit a devotional, consider the following guidelines: it should include a scripture passage, your devotional/thoughts and a short closing prayer, and fit on a half sheet of paper. That's it! If you have a favorite scripture passage or hymn and can write a short devotional or even a poem for it, or if you have a devotional that you love, please consider submitting it (please indicate the source!) An example devotion is below:

December 10 Scripture: Luke 2:9-14

Christians around the world are familiar with the end of this passage: 'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth, peace among those whom He favors!' (NRSV) The Hebrew word for peace is 'Shalom' שָׁלָוֹם . It is said often as a greeting to people and to bid them farewell. But that is only one small part of the meaning. Shalom is much more than simply peace; it is a complete peace. It is a feeling of contentment, completeness, wholeness, health, tranquility, fullness, rest, well-being and harmony, the absence of agitation or discord. It is something we feel deep inside of us. The joy of a newborn Child in a manger and a family smiling in peace and happiness - this is a peace we should not just feel during the Advent season, but throughout the entire year!

Prayer: Lord God, help us to feel and understand your shalom, which we accept so easily during Advent. Help us to be your child of peace in our own lives and to all those we encounter – this season and throughout the year. We pray for the people all over this weary world. May they have your everlasting peace. AMEN.
