SESSION NOTES FROM SEPTEMBER 10, 2018...

- Treasurer Larry Wing presented a report showing the church budget (income and expenses) is on track for the year.
- The Church insurance policy was replaced with Church Mutual Insurance Company fully covering the church and all activities. The new policy includes workers compensation. The new policy will realize a savings to the church of at least \$2,000 per year.
- Jane Hazer, from Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, reported that Bishop Matthew Reigel will be preaching at HTLC on October 14th at 9:00a.m. Everyone is invited to come and hear the Bishop. Jane also announced that the Christmas Bazaar will be held Saturday December 8th.
- The following actions were taken in relation to the Capital Gifts Funds:
 - Approved \$9,303.75 from the Angel Fund to reimburse the Treasurer for unused funds being returned to the capital gifts funds. (first vote)
 - Approved up to \$15,000 from the Angel Fund to supplement the general fund as planned. (first vote)
 - Approved \$5,000 from the Barrack Fund to support the college ministry program as a "New Worshipping Community". (second vote)
 - Approved \$1,000 to supplement the After School Program from the Angel Fund with the promise of a financial plan for the year. (second vote)
 - Approved \$2,935 to replace the electrical service at Manse #2 from the Angel Fund (first vote)
- Approved \$8,200 from the Angel Fund for new carpeting in Manse #1 (first vote) Property Committee is meeting with a stone contractor to discuss repair of the façade of our building which is leaking into the inner walls of the White Chapel. Also a complete review of the church's electrical system has been completed. New work on grounds keeping has been completed on the front of both Manses.
- Christian Education reported the resignation of Ginny Rast as our Christian Education Coordinator. The committee is discerning what moves to make next in this regard. Kids Club will begin on September 23rd.
- Rev. Alex Awad, International Peacemaker, being hosted by the College and the Presbytery was approved to preach on September 23rd.
- The Stewardship Campaign for 2018 will begin September 30th.
 - The year's theme will be "Honor the Lord" based on Proverbs 3:9-10.
- Approved the pastor's vacation request for October 9-12.
