The Presbyterian Disaster Agency (PDA) is working with Santa Barbara Presbytery, Sacramento Presbytery and the Presbytery of the Pacific to respond to the recent wildfires in California. PDA has deployed four National Response Team members to Southern California, where residents are enduring both a mass shooting and the Woolsey and Hill fires.

National Response Team members to the Presbytery of the Pacific will be embedded into the American Red Cross shelters in Pacific Palisades and San Fernando Valley, at the ARC's request, as Disaster Spiritual Care Providers. Grants will be disbursed as we receive requests from the presbyteries. In the wake of the Camp Fire, PDA has approved an initial \$7,500 grant to the Presbytery of Sacramento; grant requests are also anticipated from Santa Barbara and Pacific presbyteries, said Jim Kirk, associate for PDA's National Disaster Response. In the Presbytery of Santa Barbara, fires ignited Nov. 8, a day after a gunman killed 12 people in a country music bar in nearby Thousand Oaks. "The fires are a way of life, unfortunately, but shooting is not," said Sandy Thoits, Stated Clerk of the Presbytery of Santa Barbara. "People who are grieving had to be evacuated." People are overwhelmed and distraught. They're experiencing a wide range of emotions and reactions. Firefighters who are increasingly called upon year-round to battle fires in the wildland urban interface are seeing less and less down time. Mental health and spiritual care providers are needed in so many places right now.

This disaster is still unfolding. The PDA U.S. Wildfires account is being used for this disaster-- designate <u>DR000165</u> on the memo line of your check. Remember 100% of money donated goes directly to those in need.

## Session Notes from November 12, 2018

- \*The meeting began with a devotional led by Marshall Crawford
- \*Jane Hazer, from Holy Trinity Church thanked DMPC for the partnership between the two churches as we enter our fifth year. She also reminded the group of the Women's Bazaar on December 8 from 8a.m. to 1p.m.
- \*Capital Gifts report: The Session took second votes on a request from Bob McCutcheon to pay for his airfare to Iraq of \$885.46 from the Missionary Fund and a request from Melody Meadows for her 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary trip to South Africa of \$13,700 from the Missionary Fund. A first time voice vote was taken and passed on a request from the Property Committee of \$1500 for an assessment and work plan for repairing the stonework on the church building from Property 1 fund. Chairman Cliff Marstiller proposed a slate of new committee members which the Session approved. They are Debby Cook, Holt Chenoweth, and Kerr Kump.
- \*The Worship Committee is working with Christian Education on an intergenerational Advent church school class in December and for a children's Christmas program during worship on December 16<sup>th</sup>.
- \*The Fellowship Committee is looking for folks to donate cookies for the holiday events at the church beginning with the Service of Lessons and Carols on December 6 and including the Children's program on December 16<sup>th</sup> and Christmas Eve. The committee is also working on hosts for our after church coffee hours. They will be calling on Session committees to take turns as well as calling individuals.
- \*The Stewardship Committee is receiving pledges and time and talent card for the 2019 year. Follow-up letters will be going out to those who normally pledge but from whom we have not heard.
- \*The Finance Committee reported the current income and expense were on the expected track. The committee also distributed a draft budget for 2019 for review by the Session.
