BLESSING BOX

Our Witness/Service Committee installed a Blessing Box at the Sycamore Street entrance in December 2017. The box is being used quite frequently, and we need your help to keep it filled! If you are coming to the church for any reason, please take the time to notice if the box needs to be stocked. You may bring your own non-perishable items to place in the box. If you notice it is empty and you don't have anything with you, please feel free to use items from the Food Pantry in the White Chapel to restock the box.

Please bring items that are secure from the elements (nothing in bags or containers that may be torn or come open). Also needed are individually wrapped utensils (the kind you get with carry-out orders), napkins or handy wipes, and bags to carry the items.

Many people who visit the Blessing Box are homeless and have no way to open cans or to cook food. Please bring cans that have a "pop-top" and items that can be eaten cold.

Our Vacation Bible School kids checked and stocked the Blessing Box each day during VBS.

One comment was: "There's nothing good in there! It's all vegetables and stuff!"

So we have added Spaghettios to our shopping list for the box.



SESSION NOTES FROM THE JANUARY 14, 2019 MEETING ...

The meeting was opened with a devotional and prayer by Monica Varchetto.

- The members of the new Class of 2021 were welcomed: Steve Cook, Julia Elbon, Susan Pell, and Hillary Shryock.
- Under Capital Gifts, the Session took a first voice vote for \$10,734 from the Earle Fund for elevator upgrades. Tate Summerfield was approved as a member of the Capital Gifts committee.
- Dana Marzolf, chairperson of Worship Committee recommended that Robert McCutcheon fill the pulpit on February 3rd in Peter's absence and move communion to the 10th of February.
- The Annual Congregational Meeting to review the 2019 budget, declare the adequacy of the pastor's compensation, and review annual reports was set for Sunday, February 24th immediately following worship. A baked potato luncheon will follow hosted by the Fellowship Committee.
- Nate Garver-Daniels reported on a successful Advent Jesse Tree intergenerational Sunday School series.
- Monica Varchetto, chairperson of Property Committee, updated Session on the review of the masonry situation around the church. All are encouraged to come to the church on Saturday, January 19th to see a pictorial presentation of the needed repairs. The meeting will be at 1:00pm with a presentation by Waters Craftsmen.
- Peter Vial requested vacation time January 31 to February 3rd and continuing education time March 10-13. The request was approved.
- 2020 will be the 125th anniversary of the DMPC, and Session began the discussion on how we could mark the occasion. Persons interested in participating in the planning of the celebration year are asked to contact Dana Marzolf.
- Mike Bell, chairperson of Finance, presented the year-end financial report provided by Treasurer Larry Wing.

The Session elected Mark Armentrout as Clerk and Larry Wing as Treasurer for 2019.

DMPC Youth will be collecting cans of soup and monetary donations for our Blessing Box, which is one of our continuing efforts to assist those who are hungry in our local community. Fun Fact: Did you know that each can of Campbell's Condensed Chicken Noodle Soup contains about 32 feet of noodles?



The Souper Bowl of Caring began in 1990 with a simple prayer said at a youth group meeting by Reverend Brad Smith of Spring Valley Presbyterian Church in Columbia, South Carolina:

Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those who are without a bowl of soup to eat."

The Souper Bowl of Caring utilizes Super Bowl weekend in America to mobilize young people to fight hunger and poverty in their local communities. Its vision is to transform Super Bowl weekend (the weekend of the first Sunday in February) into America's largest youth-led weekend of giving and serving. Twenty-two churches raised \$5,700 that first year. Since then, the Souper Bowl of Caring has branched out to include schools, businesses and congregations of all faiths.

Young people collect monetary and food donations during the week leading up to Super Bowl Sunday. The total collected is reported to the national headquarters of the Souper Bowl of Caring and then **100% of the money and food collected is given directly to local charities of the participating group's choice**.

In 2018, over \$8 million in funds and food items were collected nationwide by over 3,800 organizations and given to local food pantries to help fight hunger. Our youth will be collecting cans of food and monetary donations on Sunday, February 3rd. Please give generously. Thank you!
