SESSION NOTES FROM THE FEBRUARY 11, 2019 MEETING...

*The meeting was opened with a devotional and prayer by Kim White.

- *Under Capital Gifts, the Session took a second vote on \$10,734 from the Earle Fund for required elevator upgrades. The vote was 10 in favor and 0 against. Session adopted the recommendation from Capital Gifts for the use of 2½% calculation for establishing available funds for 2019.
- *MacKinzie Smith met with the Session seeking membership in the church by Profession of Faith. The Session received MacKinzie with gratitude to God.
- *Rev. Laura Brekke Wagoner met with the Session and updated us on the work of the chaplain's office at D&E and the various programs being provided. Because the New Worshiping Community designation by the denomination for the chapel program at the College requires a local Session's oversight, Laura requested and the Session approved her administering communion three times per semester, all baptisms, and occasional communion services in the community as called upon.
- *Mark Armentrout, Clerk, reported that the annual reports to the denomination have been completed and filed.
- *Jane Hazer, from Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, reminded the Session that an Ash Wednesday Service will take place at HTLC at 7:00pm on March 6th.
- *The Annual Congregational Meeting to review the 2019 budget, declare the adequacy of the pastor's compensation and review annual reports is set for Sunday February 24th immediately following worship. A baked potato luncheon will follow hosted by the Fellowship Committee.
- *Nate Garver-Daniels reported that Bread and Broth will be led by Brad Martin this year meeting on Wednesdays during Lent at 6:00pm. Nate also reported that Holly Harper will be attending the Presbyterian Youth Triennium at Purdue University in July. Bob McCutcheon briefed the Session on the Geneva Academy that will begin in the fall.
- *Monica Varchetto, chairperson of Property Committee, updated the Session on the review of the masonry situation around the church. A meeting is scheduled Friday, February 22nd at 1pm to see a pictorial presentation of the needed repairs. Also, the Presbyterian Men and Women along with the Property committee will be purchasing a refrigerator/freezer with an icemaker for the kitchen.
- *Peter Vial requested vacation time March 14 to 17 with Robert Hermanson preaching. *Jean Snedegar reported on the new Prayer Tuesday program that will begin on
- February 19th when the sanctuary will be open for persons from the congregation and the community to come and pray, meditate, read scripture etc. from 10a.m. to 2p.m. each week.
- *The Session elected Elder Tina Vial to be their commissioner at the February 16th meeting of the Presbytery of West Virginia in Charleston.
- *Due to Moderator Peter Vial's absence on the usual day for our March stated meeting, the Session agreed to meet on call for the month of March.

WHO'S IN MY PEW? SUSAN PELL



When we were living in Laurel, MD and getting close to retirement age, I was out gardening one summer morning and not enjoying it. As usual, the humidity was zooming toward 90 percent and the temperature toward 90 degrees. When I went inside to take a break, I said to my husband, "Maybe we should think about moving someplace a little cooler when we retire." My husband Richard had grown up in the Pittsburgh area and I in northern New Jersey; and we both missed the hillier terrains, cooler summers and snowier winters of our childhood homes. A week after I had made my

comment, there was an article in the Sunday *Washington Post* about Elkins, West Virginia. The article described it as a lovely, old Victorian town in the mountains of West Virginia that is also a college town and art community and had been selected as one of the top 100 small towns and small art communities in the US. We decided to check it out as the location would also be within a reasonable driving distance to my sister in Silver Spring, MD, and our daughter and grandchildren in Shipman, VA.

That fall, we took a long weekend trip to Elkins; and, as the saying goes, the rest is history. It's hard to believe that we've been here for nearly sixteen years. A month after we arrived, I was wandering around town near the park and saw a sign for the Community Art Center advertising a new class schedule. I had done pottery as a hobby for years while I was working full time, so I was pleasantly surprised to learn that this small town in the mountains actually offered pottery classes.

While taking my first pottery class here, the Arts Center asked me if I would be interested in teaching. I said "Yes," despite the fact that I was petrified by the thought. Even though I had taught middle and high school English for seven years, I hadn't taught anything in 25 years. My husband, who had spent 32 years as a high school math teacher, decided to sign up as an adjunct professor at Davis & Elkins, where he spent several semesters teaching. He enjoyed the experience and really liked the faculty and the students. I ended up spending 12 years teaching pottery. At times I had five or six classes, so it felt like a full-time job. However, I loved the teaching, and the teaching was a wonderful way to become involved with the community.

When Jan Jenkins started taking my classes, I had no idea that she and her husband Doug were Presbyterian ministers. I just thought she was a wonderful person as well as a talented potter. After she had been in my classes for a while, Doug came over and voluntarily built shelves in the studio. I was impressed, not only by his carpentry skills, but by the quiet and unobtrusive way he completed the job, without any expectation of praise or reward.

And that is how I ended up at the Presbyterian Church. After getting to know those two, I decided to check the Church out and loved everything about it from the very beginning. After I started attending services regularly, Judy Guye Swanson, whose grandchildren were in several of my pottery classes, asked me if I would like to join Circle 2, so I did and have enjoyed Circle as well as other activities in the Church ever since.

Interestingly, the first person we met when we first came to visit Elkins was Julia Elbon, who showed us some properties around town. When we drove by DMPC, she said to us, "That's my church. If you're looking for a church, we would love to have you join us." It took a while for me to actually get here, but I am so glad I did and feel so blessed to be a part of this wonderful church family.
