SESSION NOTES FROM THE APRIL 8, 2019 SESSION MEETING...

- 1. The clerk noted the deaths of the following members: Shirley Young, Dr. S.O. Chung, and Hope Caplinger
- 2. Jane Hazer undated us on the plans for Church Women United to serve lunches during the Holy Week Services hosted by DMPC. HTLC will be holding a yard sale in June.
- 3. Capital Gifts. The Session held a first vote on \$10,500 for projects and a trip to Kenya in August sponsored by the Presbytery of WV to our sister Presbytery of Nyeri. Bob McCutcheon is leading the trip. The Session held a first vote on transferring \$30,000 from the Angel Fund to the operating fund at the request of the treasurer. This is a planned and budgeted action.
- 4. The Session acted to change the name of the Missionary Fund in Capital Gifts to the James F. Wilson Missionary Fund.
- 5. Property Chairperson, Monica Varchetto, presented the plan for refurbishing the mortar on the stone work on the bell tower and other stone work around the church.
- 6. Dana Marzolf updated the Session on plans to celebrate the 125th anniversary of the church in 2020.
- 7. Membership Committee Chairperson, Susan Pell, recommended that a bulletin board be placed in the White Chapel for announcements. Session approved the request.
- 8. The Session granted Rev. Vial's request for vacation Sunday, May 5. The Session invited Mr. Bob Hermanson to preach in Peter's absence. Communion for the month of May will be celebrated on May 12th.
- 9. The Session thanks the Dr. Lacy Class for the purchase of new chairs for the Dunham Room.
- 10. The Presbytery of West Virginia will be having its next meeting on May 16 at First Presbyterian Church of Morgantown.

MAY FRIENDSHIP DAY...

FRIDAY, MAY 3, 2018 @ NOON

This year's celebration will be held at the First United Methodist Church at 315 Kerens Ave. We will begin with lunch and fellowship at 12:00 noon. Our celebration program and business meeting will follow.

During the meeting, the Women will be collecting the Least Coin offering. The Fellowship of the Least Coin has flourished as a global ecumenical women's prayer movement. The key to the movement's success is its simplicity. Individuals or groups may join by committing to pray for peace, justice, and reconciliation among families and communities and worldwide. Each time a woman prays, she sets aside the least coin of her local currency as a symbol of the prayer. Women's national groups collect the coins and send them to the Central FLC Fund, c/o World Council of Churches in Geneva, Switzerland. The prayers offered and the least coins collected support projects for women and children around the world.
