




Greetings church family,

I spent the month of May in Cape Town, South Africa, working as a volunteer for Ons Plek, a non-government agency that supports at-risk children through various programs. This year marks my 10th year as a volunteer with the organization.

Thanks to the church's generosity, both of the shelters run by Ons Plek are now upgraded to sustainably address the challenges of ongoing water rationing due to drought conditions. Rainwater harvesting now occurs through the installation of "JoJo" water tanks and a pump system that allows the flow of stored rainwater into the main water system of both shelters.



When I wasn't working with the director of the organization, I spent my time in the township of Philippi, working with the after-school/support program that Ons Plek runs there. Our church has been a regular supporter of this program, and the program continues to grow, with the possibility of instituting workshops for the community at large, focused on how to address the harms of domestic violence. The organization was interviewing additional staff while I was there, so I assisted with candidate evaluation as well. I have always found the Ukondla project at Ons Plek to be the most rewarding because the students who participate have the *sine quo non* of education – they WANT it. The elementary students greet you at the door asking "where's my homework?" The project is overseen by a new energetic educator, Agnes, who has a strong vision of how the project can impact the community.

In addition to teaching, I helped with chores, food, and funded special "snacks" that are favorites – from oranges ("naartjies") to KFC. The project is also continuing its liaison with Cesvi, an Italian NGO that runs a domestic violence shelter on the same location, and the European Union, allowing the Ukondla students access to the outdoor space used by the youth center funded by the EU, established for students after they graduate from high school to provide a safe hang out with regular presentations and programming as well as basic computer training.

Thank you for your continued support of this project through the James Wilson Missionary Fund.
