SESSION NOTES FROM OUR MARCH 9TH SESSION MEETING...

- *The Clerk reported the death of Ms. Cristal "Kris" Carlson on March 5, 2020.

 Dr. Vial stated that her memorial service would be held at the church in May.
- * Mr. Marstiller reported that a request had been received from the Finance and Property committees for \$37,565.00 for repairs to the exterior stone work. Noting that the funds were available from the Earle Fund, the committee had approved the request. A motion was made and seconded to approve the request. After a brief discussion, the motion was approved on a voice vote of 10 for and 0 against.
- *The gas line to the manse has been turned off after a leak was discovered. Resulting in a lack of heat, hot water, and ability to cook, the committee will be working hastily to get the issue resolved.
- * Conversation was had concerning the coronavirus, and what health actions we might need to adopt. Dr. Vial suggested that we just be flexible and adapt to any further developments.

My favorite activities in Scouting are the shooting sports—archery and riflery—and the Electronics Camp Out when we stay awake for 36 hours playing video games and eating snacks.

She has completed her Cub Scout training, and was the first girl to participate in the traditional crossing over ceremony. Troop 88 (The local boy scout troup) does not currently have the structure to support girls in BSA, so Estrid is waiting to join a girl's troop when one becomes available. She likes camping, learning about the outdoors, and learning new skills.

Girl Scout Sunday...

On March 8th, we celebrated Girl Scout Sunday with another of our DMPC Youth members. Holly Harper is a member of a Girl Scout Troop which meets in the Fellowship Hall on Tuesday evenings during the school year. Holly was our guest preacher for that Sunday and she talked about the connection between Girl Scouts and Faith.

"Good morning. Many of you are likely surprised to see me up here instead of Peter. Well, I am here in celebration of Girl Scout Sunday. Traditionally, a Girl Scout offers to help during services to emphasize the connection between Faith and Scouting. The role she takes in the church is of her own choosing, but should be something meaningful and appropriate to her age. This year, my mom encouraged me to take a larger part in the service. So here I am.



My troop starts every Girl Scout meeting with a flag ceremony. Three girls are chosen as Color Guard to lead the ceremony. The "caller" gives the commands and the other two form the gates of silence. When directed, we march through the gates of silence and salute our flag. We recite the Pledge of Allegiance, followed by the Girl Scout Promise. "On my honor, I will try to serve God and my country, to help people at all times, and to live by the Girl Scout Law." The promise starts with "On my honor, I will try to serve God" This is the line that inspired Girl Scout Sunday. Girl Scouts allows its members to substitute the words Allah, Yahweh, or other terms as appropriate to her beliefs. But, Girl Scouting is a religion-based organization. Much attention is paid to the Girl Scout promise. It is short, and memorizing it is required for every level of Girl Scouts. Even the youngest girls can rattle it off.

The last line of the Promise states "... and to live by the Girl Scout Law." Only a small fraction of new Scouts can recite the Law, and the experienced ones aren't much better. Most have a general familiarity, but getting the lines in order is a challenge. The Girl Scout Law is as follows, "I will do my best to be honest and fair, friendly and helpful, considerate and caring, courageous and strong, and responsible for what I say and do, and to respect myself and others, respect authority, use resources wisely, make the world a better place, and be a sister to every Girl Scout." Today, I would like to share with you how I live by this law and what that means when serving God."

Holly then went on to "connect" each part of the Girl Scout Promise to how it helps her follow her faith and serve God.
