Dear Friends,

February 17th is the beginning of Lent this year. Unlike Christmas, Lent is not a fixed date but relates to Passover and the Jewish lunar calendar. Many Christians around the world will get ready for the celebration of the Lord's resurrection by observing a 40 day period of spiritual preparation for this most holy of days. The forty days are because it is the period of Jesus' time of preparation in the wilderness before his public ministry. Many in the early church used it as a time of special fasting and prayer. Sometimes persons were trained during this time before they joined the church at Easter.

The season of Lent is not necessarily about giving up something you enjoy but is remembering how Jesus prepared to give up his life for us. Lent can be more meaningful by taking on something that helps us remember something about Jesus. Maybe you will remember the way Jesus got up early and prayed. You may want to pray a special prayer every morning of Lent. You may want to take on a reading program of scripture or a ministry to the sick or hurting. There is no shortage of opportunities to follow Christ.

One friend of mine encourages his congregation to consider the challenge of tithing their income during Lent. I imagine that many of you do this percentage giving already, but for some, it seems simply impossible. Consider evaluating your spending and giving at the start of Lent and see how tithing during the six weeks of Lent impacts you, your budget and your spiritual life.

However you observe the season of Lent, I hope you will begin it with the mark of the cross on your forehead.

May God bless us all with a holy Lent.

The Souper Bowl of Caring began in 1990 with a simple prayer said at a youth group meeting by Reverend Brad Smith of Spring Valley Presbyterian Church in Columbia, South Carolina:

Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those who are without a bowl of soup to eat."

The Souper Bowl of Caring utilizes Super Bowl weekend in America to mobilize young people to fight hunger and poverty in their local communities. Its vision is to transform Super Bowl weekend (the weekend of the first Sunday in February) into America's largest youth-led weekend of giving and serving. Twenty-two churches raised \$5,700 that first year. Since then, the Souper Bowl of Caring has branched out to include schools, businesses and congregations of all faiths.

Young people collect monetary and food donations during the week leading up to Super Bowl Sunday. The total collected is reported to the national headquarters of the Souper Bowl of Caring and then 100% of the money and food collected is given directly to local charities of the participating group's choice.
