Dear Members and Friends of DMPC,

I am pleased to report to you the guidance below was passed unanimously by our Session.

To summarize, we ask these basic things of all of us:

- 1. To gather for worship in our Sanctuary again beginning on Sunday, August 1st, and
- 2. We will sit in the Sanctuary in every other pew, or 6 feet between households.
- 3. We will wear a facemask during worship and while singing for the sake of our children and immuno-compromised members and friends.
- 3. If you feel ill please stay home.
- 4. Radio broadcasts and live streaming on Facebook will continue.

Additional guidelines and actions of protocol that affect how we use our church:

- We will continue to focus on maintaining healthy spaces for gatherings. Our members, friends and outside user groups will follow the CDC guidelines for vaccinated and unvaccinated people at DMPC gatherings.
- 2. Sunday School classes will resume on Rally Day, September 12.
- 3. Staffed nursery and Coffee Fellowship will resume after Rally Day.
- 4. Adults supervising children, regardless of vaccination status, will wear a mask to model appropriate behavior for children.

As always, please be in touch with any questions, comments, or concerns. And please bring a facemask so you can join us on **August 1**st. Barring any unforeseen difficulties this will be the way we will gather for worship and otherwise meet together. We are sure the Holy Spirit will be present in our coming together again.

SESSION NOTES FROM THE JULY 12TH STATED MEETING OF THE SESSION...

At its July 12th meeting the Session of DMPC took the following actions and heard the following reports:

- *To invite the congregation to return to the Sanctuary for worship again beginning August 1st
- *To begin coffee fellowship gatherings sometime after September 12th, Rally Day.
- *Voted 8-0 on a secret ballot second vote to use \$12,183 from the Property 1 Fund to put towards the plaster repair and painting the White Chapel.
- *Vote 8-0 on a first vote by voice to transfer \$30,000 from the Angel Fund to the General Fund to cover deficit. This short fall was anticipated when the budget was adopted and follows a pattern of funding we have followed for a number of years.
- *Heard a report from Witness Service about the Common Ground Café which DMPC and HTLC hosted at Woodford U.M. Church on Saturday, July 10th. Our next hosting will be October 16th.
- *Heard from Christian Education about plans for Staycation Bible School which will have been kicked off at our July 18 picnic; and heard initial plans for the opening of Sunday School classes September 12th on Rally Day.
- *The Fellowship Committee reported on plans for food for the July picnic.
- *Heard an update from the Property Committee on the next phases of repair to our building.
- *Heard a report by Peter Vial on the Elkins United Christian Community Center, a new initiative in town to minister to the homeless and hungry of our community.

FROM THE PROPERTY COMMITTEE...

For those of you who have noticed the scaffolding alongside the church, here is an update:

The 1st part of our masonry has been cleaned. This is the Sycamore Street facade of the White Chapel. The work included setting up access scaffold, cleaning the facade, sealing the capstone and flashing joints at the top of the wall and repointing failed mortar joints throughout the facade with color matched mortar.

While Waters Craftsmen were working, they found some issues with the stained-glass window in the White Chapel area. The next phase of work includes the removal and discarding existing plastic glazing. Clean and grout the stained glass panels. Cut and install 3/16" Low-E glass glazing into existing framework and seal. (The E glass is the clear cover that protects the stained glass window on Sycamore street.)

The next phase will be repairing the inside of the White Chapel where the plaster is water damaged from water leaking in through the failing mortar on the outside. Stay tuned for more updates!

FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE...

July 26, 2021 Letter for the Davis Memorial Presbyterian Membership From the Session Finance Chairman-Julia Elbon, Sherri Marstiller, Larry Wing and the committee.

The waters have been rocky for the last 18 months for all of us. It will be good to resume some degree of normalcy as we worship in our tranquil facility. Looking forward to seeing everyone again as we open in 2021.

Churches worldwide are being challenged in membership and finances. We are no exception. We are continuing (as has been done over the last few years) to operate a deficit budget. The generosity of previous church members has allowed us to use the Angel Fund to cover the deficit.

At mid-year 2021 our deficit is considerably larger than we had expected. Two reasons for this: First, income is down about 7% from last year and down about the same vs. budget. Second, we expected lower expenses from normal because we were not conducting church school and did not have a Director of Christian Education. However, we had a major water problem in Manse 1 and property expenses consumed almost all of the expected lower expenses. So, not a pretty picture at mid-year.

On another subject, when we reopen we will need collection plate counters after church on Sundays. We have done this before and need several pairs responsible for the counting and security of the collection each Sunday. If you could give some time after church to help, please let me know-julia@elbon.us. Usually this is done for four Sundays. It is not difficult and there is a procedure in true Presbyterian form.

Let's invite those we know to enjoy our worship and share our times together. Growing our church is done best through personal contact.
