#### SESSION NOTES FROM THE SEPTEMBER 13TH MEETING...

At its September 13<sup>th</sup> meeting the Session of DMPC took the following actions or discussed the following topics:

- 1. Heard a devotional opening by Susan Pell
- 2. Voted in favor of a request from the Worship committee to purchase additional camera recording equipment for the Sanctuary to be paid by the Myles Capital Gifts Fund. Second vote.
- 3. Voted in favor of a request from the Property Committee to take funds from the Property 2 Capital Gifts Fund to cover expenses from repairs at the manse of \$8,118. First vote.
- 4. Heard reports from the Worship, Finance, Christian Ed, Membership, Fellowship, Property and Stewardship committees. No actions taken.
- 5. Acted in favor of a request from Peter Vial to take vacation September 21-27 and to invite the Rev. Laura Brekke Wagoner to preach in his absence on September 26.
- 6. Donnie Corbin has agreed to act as temporary chairperson of the Personnel and Nominating/Leadership Training committees.

#### LAY ACADEMY...

Both as spiritual formation for the congregation and outreach to the community, the Academy offers classes on Christianity and culture.

This semester's offerings:

<u>Does the Bible Say What It Means? Making Sense of Scripture</u>.

Focusing on key stories in both testaments, we will discuss the way their writers conveyed God's word through human language. This session began September 12th and continues on Sundays at 4:30-5:45pm

"Wherefore could not I pronounce 'Amen'?" Salvation and Damnation in Shakespeare's Macbeth.

The class will look at the theological dimensions of the play and culminate in a trip to the Blackfriars Playhouse in Staunton, VA, for a performance.

Five Thursday evenings, October 7-November 11, 6:30-7:45.

Classes will meet in Fellowship Hall, a space that lends itself to social distancing.

#### **RALLY DAY 2021...**

Rally Day was celebrated on September 12, 2021 at Davis Memorial with songs, hymns, and guitars. A gift to the church, of a handmade wooden Noah's Ark by Phil Kyle, was unveiled during children's time. Children's Sunday school classes began with a study of "The Parables Jesus Told" from the *Growing in God's Love* curriculum. Robert McCutcheon welcomed all to his Lay Academy class "Does the Bible Mean What It Says?" on Sunday afternoons at 4:30 at the church. The adult Dr. Lacy class will continue to meet on Sunday mornings at 9:30 am in the Dunham Conference room, lead by Bob and Brenda Hermanson. After worship our folks were treated to a Grab and Go picnic lunch. Box lunches were prepared by our Fellowship committee and distributed to all as they left the church. Several lunches were delivered to those who weren't able to attend worship.

#### NOAH'S ARK LANDS AT DMPC...

Phil said "I saw a picture of this ark and decided while everyone was shut in, I would work in my shop and build the ark for the children of the church." It took Phil about 3 months to build the ark, Noah, Mrs. Noah, the sons and their wives and let's not forget the animals (two of each) all were cut, sanded, and varnished.

The Genesis account of the Noah story says Noah was between 500-600 years old when God commissioned him to build the ark. And when Noah was 600 years old the flood waters began!

#### **NEW BEGINNING BACKPACK PROGRAM...**

Church Women United in West Virginia have done a most amazing job this year in providing backpacks and money for the New Beginning Backpack Program. 44 full backpacks were collected along with some added supplies to begin to put together added backpacks. Individuals from the group, churches and local units also donated a total of \$2,500.

This money will be used by Bev Sharp in the newly designated REACH Initiative, an expansion of the program previously affiliated with the West Virginia Council of Churches. Added backpacks will be prepared. Materials will also be purchased so that prisoners at St. Mary's Correctional Institute outside Parkersburg can sew duffle bag size backpacks which will hold both personal care items and clothing. This training and service initiative was begun during the pandemic lockdown.

Over and over the lyrics to the song "Whatsoever you do to the least of my brethren, this you do unto me" comes to mind. I am so very proud of the efforts of all the individuals, churches and local units who gave so generously so that our fellow brothers and sisters will have a fresh start, a new beginning, as they re-enter society.
