Advent begins November 28th when we begin to think of the coming of Jesus the Christ in the manger, as well as, Jesus the Christ the one who returns. Both appearances in scripture are in front of us in every Advent season. And the reason is that the coming of Jesus goes right to the heart of who God is. Advent is the season of waiting for the God who comes.

Dr. Eugene Peterson says it best. "God isn't an immovable object at the center of the universe. He's not a fixed point on an astronomer's map. He's active and moving – he *comes*. And this movement has direction – he comes to *US*. He doesn't wander around window shopping from galaxy to galaxy, juggling the moons of Jupiter and casually admiring the rings of Saturn. *We are his destination*. And he didn't simply come once and then return to spend the rest of eternity ... telling stories of his trip and boring the angels with slides of his visit to earth. He came, and he will come *again*. The Christian life, consequently, is lived between those two comings."

The message of the Bible is that God loved us so much the he came to us in the Old Testament and in the New, in Jesus Christ the Word of God. The message of the Bible is also that there are helpful and not so helpful ways to live together as the ones who wait for his coming. Listen during this season of Advent for clues, tips and truth about what it means to be mindful and faithful waiters for the God who comes, and comes again. Let's not let the pandemic get in the way of our welcoming our Savior and living as his Church in hope-filled and expectant ways.

The Church staff joins me in offering you our warmest blessings for a deeply meaningful Advent and Christmas Season. We look forward to waiting and welcoming by your side.

SESSION NOTES FROM NOVEMBER 8, 2021...

At its meeting on November 8, 2021 the following actions or issues were addressed:

- *The opening devotional and prayer was offered by Lynn Proudfoot. The topic of the devotional was "Gratitude" and the prayer was based on Psalm 138.
- *Cliff Marstiller assisted the Session in its second vote, by secret ballot, on a request by the Witness Service Committee for \$7,500 to fund a missionary trip to Kenya by Robert McCutcheon in early 2022. The vote was 11 for and 0 against.
- *Dana Marzolf, chairperson of the Worship Committee reported on the current state of worship in the sanctuary following CDC guidelines, Communion being served on November 7, Rev. Laura Brekke Wagoner preaching on October 17 for the "Celebrating the Gifts of Women" Service, the new Presbyterian Women's banner made by Diana Kerr in memory of Juanita Kyle, and plans for Advent being in place.
- *Julia Elbon, chairperson of the Finance Committee, reported on the October Profit and Loss statement as well as the Balance Sheet.
- *Steve Cook, chairperson of the Witness Service Committee, reported on the October 16 Common Ground Café and our responsibility for the same on February 12, 2022. He also reported on the Thanksgiving and Christmas baskets which we are doing in concert with Tyrand Ministries.
- *Sue Chenoweth, reporting for the Christian Education Committee, recommended that the church hire a Coordinator of Children/Youth at \$15.00 an hour for up to 5 hours per week. The recommendation was adopted by the Session.

The committee informed the Session that they will be allotting \$1,200 for teaching materials for Bob Mc Cutcheon's African Mission work in 2021 and 2022.

- *Monica Varchetto, Chairperson of the Property Committee, reported that repairs on the inside of the White Chapel will most likely happen in January.
- *Gary Moden, Chairperson of the Stewardship Committee, reported on the current status of our 2021 Stewardship Campaign.
- *Kim White, Chairperson of the Fellowship Committee, discussed ideas for serving refreshments after the Christmas Eve service on December 24th.
- *Susan Pell, Chairperson of the Membership Committee, reported on current projects of the committee.
- *Peter Vial reported that he will be working from home for about two weeks as Tina recovers from surgery she is having November 17.
- *Lynn Proudfoot will be our church's commissioner for the November 13 meeting of the Presbytery of West Virginia which will be on ZOOM.

LIGHTING THE ADVENT CANDLES (GOSPEL YEAR C)

This set of readings for the lighting of the Advent candles is based on the gospel lessons of the Revised Common Lectionary in Year C.

At each successive lighting of the Advent candles, all texts from the preceding lightings are read in addition to the text introduced that day.

On the First Sunday of Advent,

and at successive lightings: We light this candle [these candles] as a sign of the coming light of Christ. In Christ there is life and light for all people. (John 1)

Now lift up your heads and rejoice: your redeemer is drawing near. (Luke 21)

And on the **Second Sunday of Advent**, and at successive lightings: Prepare the way of the Holy One! All flesh will see the salvation of God. (Luke 3)

And on the **Third Sunday of Advent**, and at successive lightings: Christ has come to baptize us with the Holy Spirit and with fire. (Luke 3)

And on the **Fourth Sunday of Advent**, and at successive lightings: The Mighty One has done great things for us; holy is the name of God. (Luke 1)

And on the **Eve of Christmas, or on Christmas Day**: Behold, there is good news of great joy for all people: to us is born a Savior, the Messiah. (Luke 2)

On each occasion the lighting of the candles is concluded with: Glory to God in the highest, and peace to God's people on earth! (Luke 2)

	Third Sunday in Advent (Light two purple candles and the pink candle)	
Glue Under	We light this third candle for a world Isaiah speaks of where even the deserts sings, rejoices and blossoms. A world where everyone will see and hear, a world where everyone will dance for joy at the coming of the Lord.	Glue Under
	Read Isaiah 35: 1-10	
Fourth Sunday in Advent (Light all four candles) We light this last candle of love to proclaim that God's love is revealed in Christ born in Bethlehem. We are challenged to proclaim and reveal that same love as we live our faith. We give thanks for a love that passes our human understanding and await once more the birth of God's enduring love this Christmas. Read Isaiah 7:6-10	Christmas Eve (Light all candles and the white Christ candle) On this day, born of a woman, the Word became Flesh and dwelt among us. We offer honor, praise, worship and love to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. May our lives be like that of like Jesus and may we bear His Light into the world. Amen.	Second Sunday in Advent (Light two purple candles) We light this second candle for Isaiah's vision of a transformed world – a world shaped in accordance of God's will. Isaiah waited for the Messiah. We wait in faith that through the Holy Spirit, the Prince of Peace will be born anew in our hearts and in our lives. Read Isaiah 11:1-10
Glue Under	Use this cube to prepare for the coming of Jesus into your life this Advent season. Five candles are needed - three purple, one pink and one white. An Advent wreath is optional. A candle is lit each Sunday of Advent to remind us that Jesus brings Light to a dark world. Read the scripture passage and meditate on it and pray the suggested prayer May Jesus' Holy Light shine upon you and guide you – through this Advent season - and always! Amen!	Glue Under
