Dear Friends,

March 2nd is the beginning of Lent this year. We will begin Lent with a joint Ash Wednesday Service on the 2nd at 7:00pm in the DMPC sanctuary.

Many Christians around the world will get ready for the celebration of the Lord's resurrection by observing a 40-day period of spiritual preparation for this most holy of days. Forty days because it is the period of Jesus' time of preparation in the wilderness before his public ministry. Many in the early church used it as a time of special fasting and prayer. Sometimes persons were trained during this time before they joined the church at Easter.

As I suggested last year, the season of Lent is not necessarily about giving up something you enjoy. Lent can be more meaningful by taking on something that helps us remember something about Jesus. Maybe you will remember the way Jesus got up early and prayed. You may want to pray through the DMPC prayer list every morning of Lent. You may want to take on a reading program of scripture or a ministry to the sick or hurting. There is no shortage of opportunities to follow Christ.

However you observe the season of Lent, I hope you will begin it with the mark of the cross on your forehead given at our Ash Wednesday worship service March 2nd at 7:00pm. The service will also be streamed on Facebook.

May God bless us all with a holy Lent.

SESSION NOTES FROM THE FEBRUARY 14TH MEETING...

The following items were discussed or acted upon at the February 14th meeting:

- *Began by focusing prayer for each person on our current prayer list as well as personal requests.
- *Granted a letter of transfer for Betty Legg to the Enslow Park Presbyterian Church in Huntington.
- *Received thank yous from Rev. Vial, Mark Armentrout and Melody Meadows for the Christmas bonus each received from the Church.
- *Received a thank you letter from Davis & Elkins College for our annual budgeted donation of \$500.
- *Approved Phil Becker as a new member of the Capital Gifts Committee
- *Voted in the affirmative on a first vote to grant a request of the Treasurer, Sherri Marstiller, of \$30,000 from the Angel Fund to supplement the General Fund. This is one of two planned such transfers to supplement our planned deficit budget.
- *Approved a recommendation of the Capital Gifts Committee to set our annual spending formula at 2.5% for requests from the Capital Gifts Funds.
- *Approved a recommendation of the Membership Committee to move 18 members to the inactive roll of the church.
- *Approved a vacation request of Rev. Vial to be away Sunday, May 1^{st}
- *Approved a recommendation of Rev. Vial to invite Rev. Laura Brekke Wagoner to preach in his absence on April 24th (Vial on Con. Ed.) and May 1st.
- *Set the Annual Congregational Meeting for Sunday March 20 immediately following worship.
- *Elected Lynn Proudfoot as commissioner to the February 19th meeting of the Presbytery of West Virginia.
- *The next stated meeting of the Session will be on Monday, March 14th at 6:30pm

Weekly Lenten Thoughts and Reflections

Lent is 40 days (excluding Sundays) prior to Easter, set aside to reflect on the ministry of Jesus, on our lives, to ask forgiveness and for the strength to do better. Forty days is the time Jesus spent in the wilderness preparing for His ministry.

<u>Week One – Lenten Resolutions</u>: Christians have given special attention to prayer, fasting and charitable giving during Lent. One way to do this is to write down your resolution on a piece of paper and seal it in an envelope. You could use the Bible daily to direct your praying. You could do without a meal one day a week and use that money to help a food pantry. You could set aside some time to volunteer at a charitable organization in your community. Place this envelope in a prominent site to remind you of your resolution.

<u>Week Two – Plant a seed</u>: Jesus asks us to die to ourselves in baptism so that we can yield good fruit. (John 12:24) To get a good look at what it means for a seed to die, plant a bean seed in a clear jar filled with dirt. Plant the seed near the edge of the jar so you can watch the seed. What happens to the old seed? Those of us who have already been baptized die with Jesus by putting our faith in Him daily. Remember the fruit of the spirit mentioned by Paul in Galatians 5:22. How many do you bear?

<u>Week Three – Prodigal Son, Forgiving Father</u>: Read this parable of Jesus (Luke 15:11-32). It has much to say to us during Lent. Why did the father not object to the son's request? What made the son "come to himself?" Was the memory still alive in his heart of the goodness of his father? Why do you think the father didn't need to hear his son's explanations when he returned home? What a great man this father was to recognize what was at stake. Wouldn't you love to have a father like this? You do, you know!

<u>Week Four – Family Reading</u>: Everybody loves a good book. Why not read together as a family during Lent? Set aside some time before dinner to read some devotional material or from the Bible. If you have young children, explain the scripture passage you read and talk about it. You may want to read from a children's Bible. Read *The Bronze Bow* by E. G. Speare, a tale of teenagers set in the Holy Land at the time of Jesus. Or read *The Hiding Place* by Corrie Ten Boom – the true story of how a woman's faith sustained her in a Nazi concentration camp.

<u>Week Five – Pretzels</u>: Many centuries a monk, trying to help his church school class with daily prayer, took some leftover bread dough and shaped it like the way people used to pray – arms folded over their chest. He gave this treat to them as a reward for remembering their daily prayers. Try baking some pretzels during Lent to remind you that Jesus always prayed to God when he was troubled.

<u>Week Six – Decorate an Easter Candle</u>: This candle makes a nice centerpiece not only on Easter Sunday but also throughout the 50 days of Easter until Pentecost. Take a large white candle and decorate it with a cross and the Alpha and Omega symbols. The Easter Candle is a wonderful way to recall that the Light of Christ is in our home and in our hearts. Remember to light this candle even on Good Friday – the Light of Christ never goes out!
