SESSION NOTES FROM OCTOBER 10, 2022...

Julia Elbon offered the opening devotional on the topic of stewardship and then offered the opening prayer.

*Lynn Proudfoot was elected Clerk pro-tem.

- *The deaths of Monna Macomber and Beth Kittle were recorded.
- *The Session enacted a resolution that Sherri Marstiller be authorized to contact the WV State Treasurer to determine unclaimed property coming to DMPC.
- *Monica Varchetto, Property Comm. Chair, updated the Session on the summer flooding the church endured and the ways in which the problem will be addressed.
- *It was decided to have communion on Christmas Eve but not on Sunday, Christmas morning.
- *It was decided to take down the crepe paper restrictions on seating in the sanctuary and allow worshipers to manage their own social distancing during the ongoing Covid pandemic.
- *Julia Elbon, chair of the Finance Committee, updated the Session on the budget and spending to date. She also requested committees give her budget requests for the 2023 budget by the end of October.
- *During the Witness Service report, Bob McCutcheon updated the Session on his plans to visit and teach in Kenya in 2023.
- *The Christian Education committee recommended a crew of Sunday School teachers for the coming year and it was approved.
- *The Membership Committee announced plans for a pictorial directory for the Church with pictures to be taken in April.
- *The Stewardship Committee reported it's plans for the ongoing stewardship campaign with a letter going to the congregation in the coming week and Stewardship Dedication Sunday being held on November 6th.
- *The Nominating/Leadership Development Committee presented a slate of Elders elect for approval to be presented to the congregation for election on November 13th. That slate includes Phil Becker, Julia Cassells, and Monica Varchetto.
- *The Nominating/Leadership Development Committee also recommended that the Standard Operating Procedures be amended to allow elders to serve two consecutive 3 years terms on Session before a required year off. It had previously been our practice to limit terms to one 3 year term before a required year off the Session.
- *Walter Ridgely and Rachel Varner were received into the membership of the church by letter of transfer; Walter from the Lebanon Ohio Presbyterian Church and Rachel from the First Presbyterian Church of Buckhannon, WV.
- *The Session talked about having a brainstorming Session on community evangelism at an upcoming meeting.

PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN SCHOLARSHIP...

Education is so important today and one of the missions of the DMPC Presbyterian Women is to provide scholarships to deserving students. The Minta Hopkins Ogilvie Scholarship was established in the late 1960s in memory of George Ogilvie's wife Minta. Over the last 50 years, scholarships have been given to over 70 students.

According to the Bylaws of DMPC PW, a scholarship of \$500 is to be given annually to a High School graduate enrolled in a College or Vocational program. The Presbyterian Women's budget funds one scholarship, but we are happy to announce that we are able to give 8 scholarships because of the donations given by our congregation to the PW Scholarship Fund during the year. We thank all of you who have given gifts this year.

PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN BANNER...




