# "A CHURCH IN TRANSITION" WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE

On Sunday, January 15, 2023, the Rev. Ed Thompson, General Presbyter of the Presbytery of West Virginia, and George Lilley, Chairman of the PWV Committee on Ministry led a discussion on options and support available for a pastoral search.

Afterward, Session voted for the Nominating Committee to include representatives of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church and present a slate of five names for a "Interim Pastoral Nominating Committee" to seek a nominee for Interim Pastor for subsequent Session approval. In addition to filling the pulpit, the Interim Minister moderates Session and provides pastoral care. After Session approval on February 15<sup>th</sup>, search efforts can commence immediately for the Interim Minister. Session also assigned Worship Committee to schedule pulpit supply for three months beginning July 2nd and continuing until an Interim Minister is found.

The regular Installed Pastor search begins after Peter Vial's retirement with a PCUSA "Ministry Information Form" and the preparation of a recruiting package including the availability of the manse and an offer of housing equity. "Church Leadership Connection" is an online recruiting site for links and videos to showcase our larger area and local communities as well as congregations with which we are in partnership. Our General Presbyter emphasized the importance of sensitively and intentionally conducting a Mission Study/Self Reflection to get a feel for our needs in a minister.

The PWV Committee on Ministry will review submitted documents and prospects who are selected for interviews. Presbytery approval is not required although the General Presbyter will conduct an Executive Background Check with the Presbytery Executive of the candidate's current presbytery of membership.
