## NOTES FROM THE SEPTEMBER SESSION MEETING...

At its September 11th meeting, Session attended to the following items:

- Elder Garver-Daniels led a devotional on community and developing the practice of Stop-Look-Listen.
- \* Clerk's Report: Minutes from August 14th were approved. News from the Presbytery of West Virginia (PWV) was shared: Notes of prayers from churches in the presbytery. The Landscape Assessment Survey sent out "to gather information to consider our purpose and the ways in which we organize to be faithful to that purpose". Communion Training for Ruling Elders is scheduled for Oct. 15th on Zoom; register by Oct. 2nd. The Youth Fall Retreat at Bluestone is Nov. 12 15. Small Church Conference is Sat., Oct. 7<sup>th</sup> at Elk Hills Presbyterian Church in Charleston. Synod Sunday is Sept. 17th.
- \* Finance Committee will meet on Tuesday, Oct. 3rd, to begin work on the 2024 budget. All committee chairpersons are requested to submit proposed 2024 budgets. Voted to accept a proposal from Hart Office Solutions to lease a new copy/print/scan system, resulting in an annual savings of \$956.04.
- \* Property Committee has reached out to a local attorney and our insurance carrier for guidance to proceed with the flooding recovery process.
- \* Approved Worship Committee recommendations for pulpit supply in October as follows: Oct. 1, Rev. Kevin Starcher; Oct. 8, Robert Hermanson; Oct. 15, Lisa Wood; Oct. 22, Rev. David Bower and Oct. 29, D&E professor of Religion & Philosophy, Dr. Brantley Craig. Approved a request from Holy Trinity to invite WV-WMD Synod's Bishop Matthew Riegel to preach on November 12th, requiring a mutual agreement between the two Synods.
- \* Witness Service hosted a Mobile Food Pantry truck on September 2nd and will host a Common Ground event this Saturday, the 16th; then another Mobile Food Pantry on October 14th.
- \* Fellowship Committee: Rally Day went well. Committee is hosting a coffee fellowship after Women's Sunday Worship on October 15th. Committees interested in hosting a coffee should let them know.
- Stewardship Committee has met and outlined Minute for Mission speakers for each week of the campaign, October first through Dedication Sunday, November 5th. Articles will go out in October and November Monthly Manna Newsletters. Committee will host coffee fellowship after worship on Dedication Sunday. Letters will go out before October 20th.
- \* Moderator Dave Lee expounded on the importance of completing the Holy Cow! Consulting "Landscape Assessment Survey" promptly as this will provide vital information to move forward in the "Season of Discernment" of the Presbytery. It is also vital for members and supporters of each church to respond for geographic relevance and importance.
- \*The next meeting of Session is scheduled for October 9, 2023, at 6:30 p.m. Rev. Lee will moderate.

## STEWARDSHIP...

The Stewardship Committee has selected the theme for the 2023 Campaign based on Luke 13:18-21, the Parable of the mustard seed and the yeast. Big and small gifts are appreciated and can be used to further God's work. There is hardly a more beautiful way to speak about the hidden promise of even the smallest gift than the image of the mustard seed, so small yet holding so much possibility. Or as Luke mentions, for bakers, the yeast grows into warm bread to sustain us.

We are given so many gifts from God, and we are called to give back. Perhaps we feel our gifts are small, but we hold the promise of God's power at work among us and through our gifts. We gratefully share our gifts so that God can use them to grow just like the mustard seed becomes a large tree and yeast grows to make bread to provide sustenance for all of us to grow.

As with the parable of the mustard seed and the yeast, from seemingly insignificant gifts, the kingdom of God grows, at times invisibly and almost imperceptibly, until it reaches all nations with its transforming power.

We will begin our campaign on Sunday, October 1st. We are honored to have back in the pulpit the Rev. Kevin Starcher, who will deliver the stewardship message. Be sure not to miss this service, in person, on Facebook, or the radio.

We will also have a series of speakers starting on that first Sunday.
